Health Screening

The Dublin Women's clinic offers health screening to suit your needs. We aim to pick up problems early and offer treatment or better still through screening to prevent the problem occurring at all. We offer three health screen options, a full medical, a minimedical and a sexual health screen.

Health Screening	When to make an appointment?	How long will appointment take?	What do I need to do prior to appointment?
General Consultation	Anytime within surgery hours	15mins	Nothing
Mini Medical	Any weekday morning	30mins	Please remember to fast for 14 hours (no food but water allowed)
Full Medical	Any weekday morning	1hour 45mins	Fast for 14 hours. Bring completed medical questionnaire given to you when appt was made.
STD Testing	Any weekday	15 - 30mins	Avoid emptying your bladder for 2 hours prior to appointment.

How to make an appointment with the clinic

We hold morning, afternoon and evening surgeries. Certain consultations call for more time with your doctor than others (e.g. cervical smears, health screening etc.) so when possible, please let the receptionist know and the appointment will be made accordingly. We are aware of the need to avoid delays but sometimes the nature of general practice makes the occasional hold-up unavoidable. We thank you in advance for your patience.

Mini Medical involves the following:

- Consultation
- Blood pressure check
- Breast Examination
- Cervical Smear
- Blood tests

Cholesterol, Diabetes, liver and kidney function, thyroid and iron levels checks.

Referral for Dexa scan or Ultrasounds if needed



Full Medical

Full Medical involves the following:

- Breast exam. cervical smear test
- Electrocardiograph Heart Tracing (ECG)
- Lung Function test (Spirometry)
- Haematology Profile (FBC), Liver Function Tests (LFT),
- Kidney function tests (LTF). Thyroid function test
- Fasting Lipids(Cholesterol, LDL, HDL, Triglycerides)
- Fasting Glucose (Blood sugars)
- Haemochromatosis blood test
- Urine Analysis
- Faecal Occult Blood

Supplementary tests may be suggested and arranged in certain cases. These tests may need to be carried out in a local clinic. e.g. Blackrock Clinic, St Vincent's Hospital or Beacon Clinic and will carry an additional fee, for example,

• Chest Xray, Stress/Exercise ECG, Dexa Scan (for osteoporosis), Ultrasound Scan

Sexual Health Screen involves the following tests for:

Chlamydia, Gonorrhea, Hepatitis B, Hepatitis C, HIV, Syphilis, Trichomonas Vaginalis, Herpes and Genital Warts.

Testing will include a blood test, a urine test, a vaginal swab and in some cases a cervical smear.



Contraception

What is the best contraception for me? What has the least side effects, is it right for me at this stage of mv life? These are the sort of questions that we are asked and that we discuss in detail with women attending the Dublin Women's Clinic. The following are some options that you may wish to research before making your decision, Combined Pill, Mini Pill, Patch, Vaginal Ring, Mirena Coil, Diaphragm, Injectable Contraceptive & the Implanon. Female Fertility Consultations & Couple Fertility Services

This consultation reviews menstrual history and general health when trying to conceive with one of our female doctors.

Consultation includes:

- Day 3 & Day 21 hormonal blood tests as well as a thyroid and rubella blood test.
- Referral for pelvic scan for the woman.
- Referral for semen analaysis for the man.
- Advice and support regarding fertility and trying to conceive.
- Referral to a fertility clinic if needed.

Smears - The National Cervical Check Programme

Did you know that regular smear tests can help reduce your chance of cervical cancer by picking up any early changes that can be successfully treated? If you are between the ages of 25 and 60 you may be entitled to a free smear. You can check your eligibility on www.cervicalcheck.ie

Check and have your letter of invitation from them simply book in with us for your free smear. The best time for your smear test is between days 10 & 14 of your cycle.

The Dublin Women's Clinic also offers the cervical cancer vaccine at a competitive price and are happy to discuss the vaccine with you.

Antenatal & Postnatal Care

At the Dublin Women's Clinic we operate the free Maternity & Infant Care Scheme. You are assessed as soon as you discover that you are pregnant and your care plan is explained. For your first pregnancy you are entitled to 5 free antenatal GP visits. For subsequent pregnancies, the entitlement is 6 visits. Postnatal visits include the baby's 2 week check and the mother & baby's 6 week check up.



Please make your appointments for the dedicated clinic day as advised by the receptionist and always remember to book appointment in as Antenatal care.

Your dedicated doctor sees you for every alternate visit with vour hospital or midwife to ensure you and the baby are well and to discuss any health or lifestyle advice for your pregnancy.
